## Disability Survey in Chilika and Ersama Blocks of Odisha



An Analytical Report

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## Introduction

Government of Odisha through its rural livelihood project titled "Targeted Rural Initiatives for Poverty Termination (TRIPTI)", which is being implemented through the "Odisha Livelihoods Mission" (OLM), with financial support from the World Bank and is recently rechristened as State Rural Livelihood Mission (SRLM), as part of the National Rural Livelihood Mission. OLM, an independent society under the Department of Panchayati Raj and Rural Development, Government of Odisha, is implementing the project in 10 coastal districts of Odisha state.

Mobilization of poor to form their 'own institutions' is the primary objective of the project; for which strong institutions of the poor in the form of SHGs are constituted. Such village level and cluster level federations provide a space and voice to the marginalized sections of the society. They are the mediators to provide an accessibility of resources to the poor, in order to reduce their dependence on external agencies. These institutions act as an instrument of knowledge and technology dissemination, and hubs of production, collectivization and commerce.

Chilika and Ersama blocks of Khurda and Jagatsingpur districts respectively were chosen after a consultation with OLM staff. The first step towards the inclusion process was enumerating PwDs in the villages so as to increase their access to basic entitlements and further rolling of livelihood programmes. This was done through 2 step survey, firstly a rapid survey with 10 basic questions administered at the SHG level. The second stage was detailed survey which was on the based on the results from the rapid survey. Identification of surveyors and data entry operators was the next step. Anganwadi Workers, Asha workers and SHG members were chosen as surveyors. The major reason for their selection as surveyors was that they have developed a good rapport with the villagers and the villagers also feel comfort in communicating with them. While identifying the Data entry operators, the main prerequisite was that he/she should be well versed with computer operations. 2 days training programme for the master trainers who would be delivering training to the surveyors and data entry operators was organized and conducted. Problems faced while enumerating PwDs and Interview techniques were the major topics covered in the training. Code sheet using MS Access was designed for data entry purpose.

The survey began in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ week of January 2014 and was completed by end February 2014. Each surveyor was given the list of households provided by the block office for conducting the survey. The data entry operators started digitizing the survey data simultaneously on daily submission of filled in questionnaires by the surveyors. Continuous handholding support was provided to the operators and
their queries were resolved by the master trainers. Data entry was completed during $3^{\text {rd }}$ week of March 2014 following which analysis was started.

The major task was of placing the enumerated PwDs in specific disability category. The method followed for categorization was that the respondents were asked various questions related to functional difficulties faced by them or their family members. These responses were noted and then labeled specific disability category (as these difficulties were the symptoms of that specific category) and then disability category-wise totals were computed. Categorization of PwDs was done based on the categories as per the Rights of PwDs bill 2012. Detailed Report with more in depth analysis with interpretation is being presented. Interpretation of each of the table is done in a systematic way consisting of 2 steps namely Findings and Inferences. This would give the detailed interpretation of the tables.

## Findings

Total households covered under survey from Chilika block are 3142 out of which $73.07 \%$ were female interviewee and $26.86 \%$ were male. Female respondents were highest in Kalakaleswar whereas male respondents in Haripur as compare to the individual Panchayat totals. It's noteworthy that 2 respondents have mentioned their sex as other.

## Inferences

While conducting the survey the proportion of female respondents is high.

## Findings

Majority (42.62\%) of the households fall in the General category followed by SEBC (31.57\%) category.

## Inferences

992 households are from SEBC (31.57\%), 168 from ST (5.35\%) and 629 households (20.02\%) belong to Scheduled Caste. This reveals that all backward communities put together constitute higher than the general population (56.94\%) making the block significant for development intervention. In this case it is inevitable that the PwDs in this community would be facing higher level of deprivation.

## Findings

445 families (14.16\%) do not posses Ration Card and out of these, 171 families belong to the monthly family income of below ₹ 2000/- category. 1647 households ( $52.42 \%$ ) having BPL card, $30.18 \%$ of these families have monthly income less than ₹ 2000/-. It's surprising to note that there are 1135 families with higher income and still posses BPL card.

## Inferences

It is observed that $79.5 \%$ of the families have monthly income upto ₹ $5000 /-$ with $\mathbf{2 9 . 9 8 \%}$ of the families having 5 or more than 5 members each. For these families to meet their monthly financial requirements is a challenge

## Findings

There are 466 households with family income below ₹ 2000/- and still not enlisted in the BPL 1997 list whereas 959 households having income more ₹ 5000 are covered in the list. It's equally surprising that 56 families whose monthly income is more than ₹10000 have also found place in the list.

## Inferences

Based on the findings the list prepared by District Authorities seem to be flawed.

## Findings

726 (23.11\%) respondents are found to be illiterate and among the literates, 2012 (64.04\%) had education below $10^{\text {th }}$ standard. Only $5.63 \%$ respondents (177) possess educational qualification above $10^{\text {th }}$ standard. 3 respondents are found in the age group 0 to 5 yrs and 20 respondents in the age group 6 to 14 yrs.

Working age group (15-60 years) comprises $91.50 \%$ of the total respondents which includes 93.88 (46) of the total under graduates and $100 \%$ (38) of the graduates. $86.23 \%$ (626) of the total illiterates are
from the working age group. Also $92.74 \%$ (1866) of the total respondents who studied below $10^{\text {th }}$ standard fall in the working age group.

## Inferences

23 respondents were found in the age group below 14 yrs for which the data needs to revalidated. There seem to be a very high level of illiteracy ( $19.92 \%$ ) including below $10^{\text {th }}$ Std ( $92.74 \%$ ) in the working age group. Table above depicts that only 38 respondents ( $1.21 \%$ ) are Graduate which means that hardly $1.21 \%$ are eligible for better employment opportunities. All of these 38 respondents belong to the working age-group (1.212\% of the total 3142 respondents' posses' higher educational qualification i.e Graduation).

Findings
The above table reveals that $50 \%$ of the respondents are unemployed. Out of the remaining engaged in some or the other occupation viz house work is the major occupation (14.50\%) of the respondents followed by Self Employment (10.63\%), Other Contract Labour (7.48\%) being the $3^{\text {rd }}$ highest. 181 respondents (5.76\%) are Agriculture labourer and 179 (5.70\%) are engaged in Farming and Agriculture. Only 73 (2.32\%) respondents are engaged in government jobs. Education level of $99.44 \%$ of the respondents engaged in Farming posses education qualification upto $12^{\text {th }}$ standard or below (inclusive of illiterates). Only one graduate respondent is a farmer.

## Inferences

The above table depicts that in spite of TRIPTI's intervention in Chilika for more than 5 years, $50 \%$ of the population continue to remain unemployed.

## Findings

While it's noteworthy that $57.48 \%$ of the households have family size less than 5 members, there are 1161 (36.95\%) families with 5 to 10 members. Out of these 1161 families, only 327 families ( $28.17 \%$ ) live in Pakka house whereas 834 families (71.83\%) have house type either kaccha or semi pakka. It is pleasing to note that 77 families (78.57\%) with members more than 10 live in Semi Pakka or Pakka house. Out of the total 3142 households, 2336 (74.35\%) families live in either kaccha or semi pakka house. Only 744 (23.68\%) families have Pakka house.

## Inferences

Majority of the families (74.35\%) families reside in Kaccha or Semi-Pakka house.

## Findings

There are 451 (14.35\%) widows in the 3142 families surveyed. Though the percentage of deserted women, divorcee and separated women found is small, their presence has been figured out through the survey. Also it is noted that majority of the widows (84.04\%) belong to the families with monthly income upto ₹ 5000/- category.

## Inferences

While 22 families (21.75\%) having a widow in their family belong to the income category more than ₹ 10000/-, there 630 families ( $89.74 \%$ ) with excluded group member whose monthly family income is upto ₹ 5000/-.

## Findings

There are 622 SHGs active and distributed over 15 Panchayats. Compared to the total families surveyed Panchayat-wise, Nimikheta Panchayat has the highest number of SHG members (342) followed by Sorana (307) and Jaripada (268). Sanasari and Hatabaradi Panchayats have less number of SHG members as compare to other Panchayats.

## Inferences

There are only 3 families each from Ankula, Haripur and Nimikheta who are SHG members but SHG name is missing. $90.10 \%$ (2831) of the families have joined some or the other SHG which means only 311 families i.e. $9.90 \%$ are yet to be brought under SHG fold. The social mobilization of the poor in the SHG fold through TRIPTI seems to have worked fine.

## Findings

1008 households (41.74\%) have BPL card with $67.86 \%$ of the total families having monthly income less than ₹ 2000/-. It's surprising to note that there are 324 families with income more than ₹ 2000/- posses BPL card.

## Findings

494 ( $20.46 \%$ ) respondents are found to be illiterate and among the literates, 1381 ( $57.18 \%$ ) had education below $10^{\text {th }}$ standard. $17.85 \%$ respondents (431) possess educational qualification above $10^{\text {th }}$ standard. 1 respondent is found in the age group 0 to 5 yrs and 12 respondents in the age group 6 to 14yrs.

Working age group (15-60 years) comprises $83.48 \%$ of the total respondents which includes 88.89 (40) of the total under graduates and $92 \%$ (46) of the graduates. $75.51 \%$ (373) of the total illiterates are from the working age group. Also $83.64 \%$ (1155) of the total respondents who studied below $10^{\text {th }}$ standard fall in the working age group.

## Inferences

13 respondents are found in the age group below 14 years which needs to be revalidated. Table reveals that $75.51 \%$ of the illiterates fall in the working age group. Table above depicts that only 50 respondents $(2.07 \%)$ are Graduate. Out of these 50,46 respondents belong to the working age-group i.e. $2.07 \%$ of the total 2415 respondents posses higher educational qualification i.e Graduation.

## Findings

The above table reveals that only $15.53 \%$ of the respondents are unemployed. Out of the remaining engaged in some or the other occupation, House work is the major occupation (43.73\%) of the respondents followed by Farming \& Agriculture (19.13\%) and Agriculture Labour (9.90\%) being the $3^{\text {rd }}$ highest. 130 respondents ( $5.38 \%$ ) are Self Employed and 59 ( $2.44 \%$ ) are other contract labourers. Only $52(2.15 \%)$ respondents are possessing government jobs. On an average education level of $92.47 \%$ of the respondents working as agriculture labourers are studied upto $12^{\text {th }}$ standard or below (inclusive of illiterates). 4 graduate and 7 under graduate respondents are farmer.

## Inferences

It is inferred that out of the total 50 Graduates, 10 of them are either self employed or in government jobs.

## Findings

While it's noteworthy that $49.73 \%$ of the households have family size less than 5 members, there are 1094 (45.30\%) families with 5 to 10 members. Out of these 1094 families, only 473 families ( $43.24 \%$ ) live in Pakka house whereas 621 families ( $56.76 \%$ ) have house type either kaccha or semi pakka. It is pleasing to note that 70 families ( $61.95 \%$ ) with members more than 10 live in Semi Pakka or Pakka house. Out of the total 2415 households, 1468 (60.79\%) families live in either kaccha or semi pakka house. Only 921 (38.14\%) families have Pakka house.

## Inferences

Majority of the families (60.79\%) families reside in Kaccha or Semi-Pakka house.

## Findings

There are 276 (11.46\%) widows in the 2415 families surveyed. Though the percentage of deserted women, divorcee and separated women found is small, their presence has been figured out through the survey. Also it is noted that majority of the widows (94.58\%) belong to the families with monthly income upto ₹ 5000/-.

## Inferences

While 12 families (4.35\%) having a widow in their family belong to the income category ₹ 5000/- to 10000/-, there 333 families ( $13.79 \%$ ) with excluded group member whose monthly family income is upto ₹ 5000/-.

## Findings

There are 596 SHGs active and more or less uniformly distributed over 23 Panchayats.

## Inferences

There are 26 families who have not mentioned the SHG name. 84.18\% (2033) of the families have joined some or the other SHG which means only 382 families i.e. $15.82 \%$ are yet to be brought under SHG fold.

## Findings

Total 3783 PwDs were enumerated in the survey conducted in 14 Panchayats covering 3142 households. Although majority i.e. $\mathbf{7 7 . 8 3 \%}$ of PwDs (2944) belong to the working age group 15 to 60 years, it is equally important to note that there are 61 PwDs (1.61\%) in the 0 to 5 age group and 438 PwDs (11.58\%) in the 6 to 14 yrs.

## Inferences

Table above reveals there are 438 PwDs (11.58\%) are yearning for education facility and 2944 PwDs (77.83\%) in search of livelihood.

## Findings

From the data above it is alarming to note that as high as $95.1 \%$ (2988) of households reported having disabled member in the family. Out of these 2988, 2342 families (74.54\%) have reported having only one PwD whereas there are 523 families with 2 PwDs and 104 families having 3 PwDs in their family. 14 families are found with 4 PwD members in their family and there are 3 families with 5 PwDs each. Also 2 families are found with 6 PwDs in their family.

## Inferences

74.54\% of the households have reported having PwD member in the family and $20.56 \%$ of the families have more than 1 PwD. The vulnerability due to poverty as well as having a disabled member in the family brings the entire block in an alarming human development index.

Out of the total 3783 PwDs, only 839 (22.18\%) of them have the disability certificate.

## Inferences

Only $22.18 \%$ of PwDs have disability certificate which shows the gap between viz PwD and government services. Further there is a gender gap of approximately $11 \%$ between male and female regarding distribution of disability certificate.

## Findings

Only 237 PwDs (6.26\%) mentioned that they had received the government assistance. 3699 PwDs ( $97.78 \%$ ) clearly mentioned that they had not received any assistance from the government and 58 PwDs remained silent.

## Inferences

From the above figure it is found that 237 PwDs have stated that they have received assistance from the government. However, when asked individually regarding types of assistance it is noted that 575 PwDs were benefited under Pension scheme, 571 PwDs were covered under MGNREGA and 365 PwDs under IAY. While analyzing the details of 839 PwDs who have certificate, 116 of them have reported being benefited from government services. The figure in excess in Pension, MGNREGA and IAY go to suggest that these families may have benefited under the general category and not specific to disability.

The table above depicts that 1951 PwDs (51.57\%) are members of some or the other DPG with higher number of females (66.07\%) being DPG members than male (33.88\%).

## Inferences

It was very heartening to know that above $50 \%$ of the total PwDs enumerated are DPG members. Such DPGs set examples of Inclusion of PwDs in not only microfinance but other social sector as well. \% of data unavailability regarding DPG member status is high. If this data is known it would either increase the percentage of DPG members or increase the number of PwDs to be brought under DPG fold.

## Findings

The population of multiple disability is highest (40.89\%) followed by Visual with $17.13 \%$ and Hearing Disability with $10.52 \%$. A point is to be noted that together the figure of multiple disability and Visual constitutes more than $50 \%$ of the total disabled population. It is observed that $7.90 \%$ PwDs are Locomotor and 7.19\% PwDs have Mental Retardation. 24 autistic people are found in the block. Also 250 PwDs (6.61\%) with mental illness and 180 PwDs (4.76\%) with learning disability are observed.

## Inferences

The respondents were asked various questions related to functional difficulties faced by them or their family members. These responses were then labeled specific disability category (as these difficulties were the symptoms of that specific category) and then disability category-wise totals were computed. The functional assessment will further clarify the extent of difficulties and potential for residual use, factor most important for livelihoods planning.

## Findings

The age group 31 to 50 years have highest percentage (41.40\%) of PwDs (1566) followed by 702 PwDs in the age group 15 to 30 years. 61 PwDs fall in the age group 0 to 5 years and 438 in the age group 6 to 14
i.e. total 438 PwDs are of the school going age group. While observing category-wise maximum, out of the total 24 autistic children, 9 belong to the age group 15 to 30 years and 8 belong to 6 to 14 years. Except Autism all other disability categories are observed commonly in the PwDs above 15 years of age. Speech disability is cited maximum in the age group 15 to 50 years.

## Inferences

## Findings

The table above describes that out of the 839 PwDs (22.18\%) who have the disability certificate, 444 of them ( $52.92 \%$ ) have multiple disability followed by 82 from Visual and 68 from Locomotor category
respectively. 67 PwDs have mental retardation and 62 of them are hearing impaired who possess disability certificate.

## Inferences

Though it is observed that 7 autistic children have received disability certificate, in reality they may have been placed under the category "mental retardation" especially given the fact that diagnosing autism require greater degree of expertise which the district or block hospital seldom has such superspecializations.

## Findings

Table reveals that out of the 839 PwDs who have the disability certificate, 116 of them (13.83\%) have received government assistance rest i.e. 723 PwDs remained silent to this question even though they posses disability certificate. However it's surprising to note that when questions related to benefits from specific scheme or whether received any assistive devices were asked, the responses received were higher than govt. assistance received PwDs. Kind of assistance received by PwDs include majorly Pension (314 PwDs), MGNREGA (168 PwDs) and 107 PwDs received houses under IAY. Only 16 PwDs received 3\% job reservation and 11 received the scholarship. 12 PwDs had availed the Loan facility. 40 PwDs received Crutches \& Tricycle/ Wheelchair and 5 received the artificial limb. Only 10 PwDs received the hearing aid as against it is observed that there are 62 PwDs with hearing disability who possess the disability certificate.

Total 3174 PwDs were enumerated in the survey conducted in 23 Panchayats covering 2415 households. Although majority i.e. $\mathbf{7 1 . 6 1 \%}$ of PwDs (2273) belong to the working age group $\mathbf{1 5}$ to $\mathbf{6 0}$ years, it is equally important to note that there are 64 PwDs (2.02\%) in the 0 to 5 age group and 317 PwDs in the 6 to 14 yrs .

The population of multiple disability is highest (71.87\%) followed by Visual with $8.32 \%$ and Hearing Disability with $5.99 \%$. It is observed that $3.28 \%$ PwDs have mental illness and $2.87 \%$ PwDs have Mental Retardation. 13 autistic people are found in the block.
